If your child is in receipt of Disability Living Allowance payments. We can apply for a priority pass, no earlier than one month before our visit. A priority pass enables your child plus 4 others priority access onto rides and attractions decreasing the wait time.

In order for us to be able to do this we will need an electronic passport style photograph of your child to attach to the application and original documents stating that your child is entitled to/ in receipt of Disability Living allowance. This original document then needs to be taken with us to Paris and shown as proof to collect the priority pass when we arrive at Disney.



Wristbands – children will wear an emergency contact wristband for the duration of the visit for safety.
