### **Poetry Competition**

#### What can I write about?

The poem is to pay tribute to the Queen on her Platinum Jubilee, which either honours the past, celebrates today or looks forward to the future.

Suggested topics:

- What the Queen means to you or the Country/Commonwealth;
- The Queen's service to her people over her reign.
- A memorable event which the Queen has been involved in during her reign.

You can write in any style or form that you choose. It could be serious, funny or sad, rhyming or not, true-to-life or entirely imaginary.

#### Categories:

- Key stage 2
- Special schools Key Stage 2

#### The Rules:

- Poem can take any form or style, but try to keep it under 20 lines
- The poems must be the child's own, original piece of work
- Closing date for entries is Friday 29 April 2022
- Maximum of one entry child
- The winning entry for the additional <u>Chairman's Special prize</u> will be read out at a special Platinum Jubilee service scheduled to take place on the afternoon of Thursday 2 June 2022 at Chester Cathedral. The winner and their family will be invited to attend. The winner may wish to read out their own poem or arrangements can be made for it to be read out on their behalf.
- The pupil's name, age, school year and name of the school must appear on the back of or clearly with each poem.
- Schools are free to select one year to enter the competition or send entries from various years.
- Unfortunately, the Civic Team will be unable to return any entries.

Prizes and certificates will be awarded to the winners from each category and there may be additional runner up prizes awarded at the discretion of the judges.

- Portrait of the Queen at any stage during her reign
- The Queen at a memorable event during her reign.
- The Queen with other members of the Royal Family.

You can produce a piece artwork on paper up to size A3.

#### Categories:

- Key stage 1 & 2
- Special schools Key Stage 1 & 2

#### The Rules:

- The art must be the child's own, original piece of work
- Maximum A3 size.
- Closing date for entries is Friday 29 April 2022
- Maximum of one entry per person
- The winning entries will be on display on the Lord Mayor's website and at the special service on the afternoon of Thursday 2 June 2022 at Chester Cathedral.
- The pupil's name, age, school year and name of the school must appear on the back of each artwork.
- Schools are free to select one year to enter the competition or send entries from various years.

Prizes and certificates will be awarded to the winners from each category and there may be additional runner up prizes awarded at the discretion of the judges. The winner will be posted on the Lord Mayor's website. <u>www.lordmayorofchester.gov.uk</u>.
